Chapter N safety Article – May 2007 – By Wayne Gargus, Chapter Educator

DISTRACTED DRIVING:

What's a distraction? The number of possible distractions while driving is nearly limitless. They include everything from shaving with an electric razor to being lost in your thoughts. A recent study found the threshold for causing a significant distraction was anything that causes you to glance away from the road ahead for two seconds or longer. This raised the risk of an accident or near miss by about two times the normal driving risk. The study also reported that some glancing away from the road is good. The most attentive form of driving is when you engage in frequent, brief glances away from the forward roadway to do things such as check your speed, look in your mirrors every 5 to 8 seconds, and assess your driving environment. Know what's going on around your vehicle at all times.

Keep your eyes on the road. When it comes to distracted driving, cell phones seem to get all of the bad press. True enough, cell phone use is indeed a driving distraction that, by one estimate, may account for about 60,000 auto accidents a year in the U.S. But talking on a cell phone is hardly the only type of driving distraction, nor is it the most likely to cause an accident. Eating, looking at a map, reaching for something within your car, and watching something outside your car, such as an accident scene, are some of the more common distractions that are at least as likely, or more likely to lead to an accident. Distractions and inattention while driving are estimated to cause 1.2 million crashes or about 25 percent of all crashes on American roads annually. Additionally, traffic accidents are the leading cause of death among younger age groups. Learning how to keep your focus while driving may keep you and your vehicle out of harm's way. A 2006 study showed crash or near miss accidents increased 6 times when driving while drowsy.

Concentration tips. It may not be feasible to eliminate every distraction as you drive, but you can reduce your level of distraction by not: **A.** Staring at things outside the car such as street signs, construction sites, animals, or auto accidents. **B.** Using your cell phone. **C.** Looking at a map. **D.** Fumbling with anything be it a radio dial, compact disc, or lunch bag. **E.** Reading. **F.** Grooming yourself or applying makeup.

Things you can do to minimize distraction include: **1.** Caging, leashing or harnessing your pet before you travel. **2.** If you must eat or drink, have a passenger hand you items or arrange the items within easy reach while you are stopped. **3.** Taking a few moments before you begin your trip to make car adjustments such as adjusting seats, mirrors, seat belts, and the radio. **4.** It's best to pull over to use your cell phone. But, if you insist on driving while using it, keep the conversation brief and have a passenger dial the number for you.

Extra vigilance. As you age, a number of factors may impact your driving ability. You may be less flexible, your reflexes may slow, and your hearing and vision, especially night vision, tend to decline. These changes are all the more reason to minimize distractions while you drive and to stay as focused as possible.

SEAT BELTS SAVE LIVES – Not only is it a law to properly fasten your seat belt and assure that all passengers in your vehicle are properly restrained as well, it has been proven many times over that seat belts save lives. When a person is ejected from a vehicle, the result is almost always a fatality. Even low speed crashes into immovable objects can be fatal without a seat belt. "Always buckle up and live a long and productive life."

DRAG BIKE IN GROUP RIDING

As just one more example of how an experienced drag bike can add considerably to the safety of a group ride, take the case of your group riding along and seeing a sign that shows that either the right or left lane is about to merge into one lane ahead.

Normally, the lead bike will position the group so that they are in the remaining lane well before the other lane collapses. The danger, of course, comes when some vehicle tries to sneak ahead of the group by racing along that collapsing lane and runs out of road. He has no alternative then but to jam him way into the middle of the group.

An effective lead-bike/drag-bike team cures this problem before it happens. As soon as either of them realizes that one of the lanes is going to disappear, the drag bike is asked to, or merely announces, that he is going to “close the door.” While the group is positioned into the continuing lane, the drag bike rides, by himself, in the collapsing lane. As soon as the collapsing lane has disappeared, the group is once again “family.”

NEW RULES OF THE ROAD: DEFENSIVE DRIVING TIPS

Today’s newest cars and trucks are loaded with advanced safety technology designed to prevent an accident or minimize injuries in the event of a crash. Still, even though our cars are becoming safer, there hasn’t been much of a reduction in accidents. One possible reason is that millions of us are driving new cars, but we haven’t changed our outdated and even unsafe driving habits. It might be time to think about a refresher Defensive Driving Course. Here are some of the new rules of the road:

- **OLD HABIT:** Pump your brake when you need to make a sudden stop.
NEW RULE: Press the pedal hard and hold, if your car has an anti-lock braking system. (ABS) If the pedal pulses, it is just a sign that the system is working allowing you to stop and steer at the same time.
- **OLD HABIT:** Hold the steering wheel between our thumbs and forefingers.
NEW RULE: Grip the wheel in a palm-forward position so that the thumbs are pointed up and are in contact with the front rim of the steering wheel. The remaining fingers should be gently wrapped around the back side of the wheel. Keep your fingers away from the inside of the wheel to reduce the chance of a wrist injury if the air bag deploys, and also to increase steering sensitivity.
- **OLD HABIT:** Set your outside mirrors so you can see the sides of your car.
NEW RULE: Adjust the mirrors out so the sides of the car are Just Outside your view.
- **OLD HABIT:** Leave plenty of room between you and the steering wheel.
NEW RULE: You should be able to rest your wrists atop the steering wheel with elbows slightly bent, which makes it easier to steer. You want to feel what your car is doing. If you’re too far from the wheel, you can’t see or turn well. But, don’t sit too close either. You could be injured by an inflating air bag.
- **OLD HABIT:** Place your hands on the steering wheel in the “10 & 2 o’clock” position.
NEW RULE: Adopt a lower 9 & 3 or 8 & 4 o’clock position. One reason is that it lessens the chance of an injury, such as a broken nose, if the air bag inflates and a forearm is pushed back into the driver’s face. At 10 & 2, the driver can only turn the wheel a little before the arm is forced to cross the center of the steering wheel which holds the air bag. At 9 & 3 or 8 & 4, the driver has more range with which to steer out of trouble before the arm moves across this so-called “explosive zone.” Drivers say they feel less fatigue in their wrists, elbows, and shoulders in this position.
