7/14/07 – DINNER RIDE, TOP OF THE RIVER GUNTERSVILLE – Depart Kangaroo 5 PM, K-Mart in Albertville at 5:45 PM or meet at the restaurant 6 PM.

7/18/07 – **(WEDNESDAY)** – BREAKFAST AT SHONEY'S EAST GADSDEN 8 AM - THIS IS ALSO THE 16TH ANNUAL RIDE TO WORK DAY - (NOTE: TURN LEFT AT THE TRAFFIC LIGHT ON MEIGHAN AND ENTER SHONEY'S FROM THE REAR) Following breakfast, we will ride scenic Lookout Mountain Parkway to Chattanooga, TN and have lunch at Bea's. It's served family style on tables with a lazy Susan. Cost is less than \$10 person including drink. Lotto tickets in GA and TN for those who wish to purchase.

7/20/07 – **(FRIDAY)** – SONIC NIGHT ICE CREAM SOCIAL 7 PM – at the Sonic on Meighan Blvd. West of Cycle World. Moonlight ride afterwards according to the wishes of attendee's.

7/21/07 – **(SATURDAY)** CHAPTER PICNIC AT THE HOME OF STEVE AND CINDY GARRISON – They have been gracious enough to offer us the use of their huge pavilion on the river. You can arrive by land or boat. This will be a covered dish, crock pot, etc. event with everyone contributing to the food list. The Chapter will provide BBQ meat, sauce and bread, all paper plates, cups, etc., plastic wear, soft drinks & iced tea & ice. A food list will be passed around at the July Gathering to list the foods you intend to bring. DIRECTIONS: (1) The address is 1622 Sibert Drive which runs between Hwy 77 & 431 South of Gadsden. From Hwy 77 coming from the South, turn right on Fowlers Ferry Road. This is the last turn possible before going over the river bridge into Southside. (From the North, it will be the first left after the bridge). Go about 1 mile to a stop sign. Go through the stop sign and about 1 more mile. Sibert Drive will be in a woodsy area on your left. Turn left, then left again after passing water on the left. About ¼ mile to 1622 on the left. (2) From Hwy 431 coming from Gadsden, turn right on Green Valley at mile marker 254. Go 1.8 miles and turn right thru a Cemetery. The road sweeps to the left and go about 1 mile. Turn right on Cottonwood Lane and you'll go over a hill. Then left at the stop sign. You are now on Sibert Drive. Go about 1 more mile to 1622 on the right in a left hand curve. (3) From the river, we are about 2 miles upstream from the Hwy 77 bridge and maybe 6 miles downstream from downtown Gadsden. There is an island in front of us and another island slightly downstream. The pavilion is very visible between the two islands but **DON'T TRY TO CUT BETWEEN THEM.** (SANDBAR) Come out of the main channel on the upstream side of our island and then next to shore down to us – 8-10' all the way. Swimming in the river is allowed, so bring your swim suits if you wish to swim. Extra folding chairs will be helpful. **WE HOPE TO SEE ALL CHAPTER N PARTICIPANTS THERE.**

SMART CARS AND MOTORCYCLES, DUMB DRIVERS

Chapter N safety article.....July 2007 - By Wayne Gargus, Chapter Educator

Cars and motorcycles are getting smarter; drivers aren’t, according to a recent article in the Birmingham News. Vehicles today can parallel park, warn of impending front and rear crashes, tell us when tire pressure is low, help maintain control with ABS brakes,

protect us in serious crashes with air bags and seat belts, and the list goes on and on. But these devices can't stop people from chatting on cell phones, road rage, and so many other things that take a drivers concentration from his/her driving responsibilities.

"The car, the road, the driver: The driver is still the weak link," according to transportation research at the University of Alabama. Federal Transportation Officials have indicated more research and emphasis on crash avoidance is being implemented, but from my perspective, it's strange that there was no mention of improving and/or requiring driver education. I recently attended an 8 hour defensive driving course presented by AARP. It's amazing how much you can learn concerning changes in traffic laws, and good driving habits that you've forgotten. As vehicles we drive and motorcycles we ride have more safety features added to compensate for our mistakes, are we becoming too dependent on them to protect us in spite of our driving errors??

Ten percent of all crashes in AL in 2005 were caused by tailgating. Do we think we can drive on the highways like NASCAR drivers do on race tracks? Apparently many drivers do, because we see them driving too close to the vehicle ahead every day. For your own safety, be keenly aware of your following distance and stay at least 3 seconds behind the vehicle ahead. Check your rear view mirrors every 5-8 seconds and be continuously aware of conditions surrounding your vehicle at all times.

Is research for more ways to compensate for bad driving/riding going too far? They're currently studying locusts, to determine why they do not crash into each other as they fly in hordes. They are also studying whether external air bags could protect pedestrians. Never mind teaching drivers to be better drivers; put more safety devices on our vehicles and let dumb driving continue. None of us think we are bad drivers/riders. Eighty percent say they are good drivers. Then why is human failure responsible for 90% of all highway crashes nationwide & 95% in AL? Leading causes of crashes in AL are; failing to yield right of way, loosing control, misjudge stopping distances, & DUI. Contributing causes such as talking on cell phones, text messaging, eating, etc. are lumped into the "driver not in control" category.

The 5 major causes of highway fatalities in AL are: (1) Risky driver behavior (2) Drivers running off the road (3) Tailgating (4) Speeding, & (5) Drinking and driving. Last year, 578 people died in crashes on AL roads when they had seat belts available but were not using them.

As vehicles get smarter, drivers are beginning to depend on them more, but technology cannot replace common sense. AL Trooper Sgt. Tim Sartain echoed those words: "Common sense is a commodity in short supply on AL highways." Still no mention of training drivers; build smarter vehicles.. ???

Research continues today on technology that offers: a. ADAPTIVE CRUISE CONTROL that adjust the throttle and brakes, b. LAND-DRIFTING WARNINGS FOR INATTENTIVE DRIVERS, c. SYSTEMS THAT BRAKE when a car is rounding a curve too fast, d. SENSORS TO IDENTIFY ROADSIDE OBJECTS, e. BLIND SPOT DETECTION, f. BRAKES THAT WILL RECOGNIZE WHEN A DRIVER MAKES A PANIC STOP and apply additional pressure, g. NIGHT VISION to help drivers see farther & spot objects, h. EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEMS capable of turning on interior lights, unlocking doors and shutting off fuel when airbags deploy. All excellent systems still operated by dumb drivers.
