SAFETY IS AN ATTITUDE – GET A GOOD ONE; YOUR LIFE DEPENDS ON IT
Chapter N Safety Article – June 2007 – By Wayne Gargus, Chapter Educator

FOUR WHEELS MOVE THE BODY. TWO WHEELS MOVE THE SOUL.

- Riding faster than everyone else only guarantees you'll ride alone
- Never hesitate to ride past the last street light at the edge of town.
- Never do less than forty miles before breakfast.
- If you don't ride in the rain, you don't ride.
- A bike on the road is worth two in the shed.
- Respect the person who has seen the dark side of motorcycling and lived.
- Young riders pick a destination and go. Old riders pick a direction and go.
- A good mechanic will let you watch without charging you for it.
- Sometimes the fastest way to get there is to stop for the night.
- Always back your bike into the curb, and sit where you can see it.
- Work to ride and ride to work.
- Whatever it is, it's better in the wind.
- Two lane blacktop isn't a highway – it's an attitude.
- When you look down the road, it seems to never end – but you better believe it does.
- Winter is Nature's way of telling you to polish that chrome.
- Keep your bike in good repair: Motorcycle boots are not comfortable for walking.
- People are like Motorcycles: each is customized a bit differently.

We've had some good rides recently, both long ones and shorter ones. It's riding season, so if you haven't joined in the fun yet, we hope you will come ride with us. I want to ask a favor from everyone who rides on our group rides. Two recent long rides required us to leave at 6 AM, and ride faster than we normally would in order to reach our destinations at the event starting time. Our arrival at the start time should not take priority over safety and I feel it has at times. If you ever feel uncomfortable at the speed we're riding, PLEASE bring it to our attention. No one should ever ride outside their own personal comfort zone. If you are not comfortable with the speed of the group, you become a hazard to yourself and others riders in the group, so please speak up and let's practice what we preach. Safety should be first in all rides.

DO YOU KNOW – that due to a recent change in AL law, if you are meeting a stopped school bus with it's red lights and left side STOP sign displayed, you are no longer required to stop if traveling on a highway where traffic is divided by a median or safety barrier.

ROAD DEBRIS CAUSES 25,000 ACCIDENTS ANNUALLY AND KILLS 80 PEOPLE..

Items range from small parts off vehicles to very large items. When following behind a car, truck, or vehicle other than a motorcycle, it's easy to run over something in the roadway. Items so small that car drivers straddle them and keep going can be a problem for us on motorcycles, because we don't see them until the vehicle ahead has passed over them, and many times it's too late to swerve. It's a good idea to increase your following distance and always be alert. During the coming hot summer months, truck tire pieces (alligators) will be seen more frequently on the roads, so please keep a keen eye out for anything in the road that could present a problem.

Paris Landing State Park

Having spent an enjoyable overnight at both Fall Creek Falls and Montgomery Bell State Parks, we decided to visit another Tennessee State Park during Memorial Day Weekend. Paris Landing became our choice based on available lodging. Paris Landing is located on the Tennessee and Kentucky border, along the bank of the Tennessee River/Kentucky Lake. So, about 8 AM Sunday morning we began our ride. Our route took us North on hwy 231 to Huntsville, then hwy 53/31 onto Pulaski Tennessee. We then rode West on hwy 64 through Lawrenceburg onto Waynesboro Tennessee. At Waynesboro we turned North on hwy 13. After lunch in Linden Tennessee, we rode West on hwy 412 to Parsons Tennessee, then again North on hwy 69/641 to Paris Tennessee. Just out side Paris we took hwy 218 which is a bypass around the city, which allowed us to connect with hwy 79 for our ride to Paris Landing State Park. Our return route home on Monday was the same route with the exception of approximately 25 miles on the Natchez Trace. At lunch time, we just happened to be passing the Dave Crockett State Park near Lawrenceburg, so as Wingers do, we stopped for a buffet lunch. Our total ride covered 562 non-interstate miles.
